PARKING
Corinthia has private parking up to 70 cars and charges €15.00/day.

LANGUAGE
The language for the conference is English. No translation service will be arranged.

AIR TRAVEL
All major European airlines serve Lisbon International Airport (or Portela Airport) (LIS), and also some low cost airlines do too. LIS is located very close to the city center and can be easily reached by taxi or bus.

AIRPORT TO HOTEL

Lisbon International Airport
After the Immigration and Customs Control, follow the Exit signs. Outside the airport you will find taxi and bus stops.

Taxi
Taxi ride is most convenient when you carry travel luggage. There are two (2) taxi stands within the perimeter of the airport, one at Arrivals and the other at Departures.

The fare on the taxi meter should read €2.00 (daytime pick-up) or €2.50 (night time pick-up) as you enter. The distance between the airport and the hotels of ISOPE participants is within the city limit. Outside the city limits, fare rates must be calculated on the basis of the distance (km) travelled and the established price per km.

Transport of baggage or animals is subject to a surcharge of €1.60. A surcharge of 20% is applied for services on Saturday, Sunday and holidays and for night services from 21:00 to 06:00.

Taxi Voucher. You may also obtain a **Taxi Voucher** at the Tourism Information Counter (or click on the flag for a language and "transport" and "taxi voucher" at www.atl-turismolisboa.pt) in the atrium of the Arrival Hall or the hall just outside the customs check. There are different fares depending on the address you are going to. Fare to Corinthia Lisboa

Hotel would be €15.37 on weekdays during the daytime and €18.44 at night or on weekends. Taxi fare in June or July is subject to change.

Aerobus service

On a daily basis, buses on the nº 91 route, called the Aerobus CARRIS, make the run between Lisbon International Airport and the city centre. Service begins at 07:45 and ends at 20:15. Buses run every 20 minutes. The ticket may be purchased from the driver as you board the bus; ticket for all-day travel cost €3.10.

This bus doesn't go as far as Corinthia Lisboa Hotel. You will have to get off at MARQUÊS DE POMBAL stop, take the underground Blue Line and exit at JARDIM ZOOLOGICO stop.

CURRENCY EXCHANGE

Cash dispensers (ATMs) that accept all major credit/debit cards can be found just outside the Customs area at Lisbon International Airport as well as throughout the city.

Currency exchange services will charge either a flat fee for small denominations or a percentage of the amount exchanged: Usually the exchange rate is more favourable at the banks. Major credit cards are widely accepted at hotels, department stores and restaurants.

LISBON SHOPPING CARD (for getting discount in a number of shops in Lisbon)

Available at any Tourism Office in the city, this card, valid for either 1 or 3 days, provides discounts from 5% to 20% in more than 200 shops in Av.da Liberdade, Chiado and Baixa (Downtown).

The card valid for 1 day costs €3.70 and for 3 days costs €5.80.

TAX FREE FOR TOURISTS

A number of shops all over the city are signed with "Tax Free for Tourists." In these stores you may fill up a form after purchase that will allow you to be refunded of the amount of the IVA tax (or VAT); this tax can be either 5%, 12% or 21%, depending on the kind of product. You will get the refund in the Global Refund counter at the airport, when after you check-in to your flight out of Portugal.

CITY TRANSPORTATION

Within the city it is best to take public transportation.

CARRIS buses and *METRO* underground run regularly and will take you to almost everywhere in the city.

CARRIS Buses:

The ticket may be purchased from the driver as you board the bus; price: €1.20.

Or you can purchase in advance the card CARTÃO SETE COLINAS of 5 unities (€3.55) or 10 unities (€6.65). The card costs €0.50 fee and can be bought in any Underground station: 1 unity means 1 ride.

METRO Underground:

Ticket for one journey (1 zone): €0.70

Ticket 10 units (1 zone): €6.65

Round-trip ticket same day (1 zone): €1.30

Combined tickets CARRIS/METRO Underground:

Ticket for one journey (1 zone): €1.10

1 day ticket (unlimited travel): €3.30

5 days ticket (unlimited travel): €13.20

Buy the card CARTÃO SETE COLINAS at the fee of €0.50 to have these tickets.

Train to Estoril/Cascais:

There is a train line that rides from Lisbon downtown (Cais do Sodré or Chiado) to Cascais, stopping in several beach towns such as Estoril. The ride to Cascais in a semi-direct train lasts 32 minutes and trains leave every 15 minutes during the day.

A single one-way ticket from Lisbon to Cascais costs €1.55.

Train to Sintra:

A train to Sintra passes in Sete Rios station (besides the Corinthia Lisboa Hotel) every 10 minutes during the day and takes 35 minutes to arrive at Sintra. A single one-way ticket to Sintra costs €1.55.

ELECTRICITY AND ADAPTER

Voltage: 220/380 volts at a frequency of 50 Hertz. All sockets follow European standards. To use American-type plugs, a 220-volt transformer should be used together with an adapter plug. Only a limited number of adaptors may be available at the hotels for the guests.

TIPPING

Tipping is advised in most places as the service charge is not included in the bill in Portugal. Advised tip is 10% (max).

SCHEDULES: Bank, Restaurants and Stores

* Stores and offices in Portugal are usually open 09:00 to 13:00 and 15:00 to 19:00.

* Pharmacies keep the same opening hours as the rest of the shops but, in order to guarantee 24-hour service, some stay open after 19:00.

* Banks open from 08.30 to 15:30.

* Generally the restaurants are open for lunch from 12 noon to 15:00 and for dinner from 19:00 to 22:00.

* Cinema showings begin at around lunch-time and, at some cinemas, there are sessions until 02:00. Theatres and other shows usually start between 21:00 and 22:00.

WHAT TO SEE IN THE CITY: www.atl-turismolisboa.pt

Lisbon is known as the white city, thanks to its unique luminosity. The light, the atmosphere and the climate provide marvellous walks all over the city. The beauty of the city is more than its monuments, old quarters and wonderful sights, it is a mixture of senses that can be experienced throughout the streets, squares and avenues.

Historical quarters: Please take note of the following translations:

Castelo = Castle ; Igreja = Church; Mosteiro = Monastery; Convento = Convent; Torre = Tower; Casa = House; Palácio = Palace; Sé Catedral = Cathedral; Museu = Museum

:

- Alfama/Castelo/Mouraria

The Alfama is one of the oldest quarters in Lisboa. Since it largely survived the earthquake of 1755, the area still retains much of its original layout.

Adjacent to the Alfama are the likewise old quarters of Castelo and Mouraria, on the western and northern slopes of the hill that is crowned by St. George's Castle. Every year in June, the streets of all three quarters come alive with the feasts in honour of the popular saints. The Graça quarter and the churches of São Vicente de Fora and Santa Engrácia are within walking distance of this area.

- Bairro Alto/Bica

Laid out in the 16th century, the Bairro Alto (literally "high quarter") is one of the most picturesque quarters in the city. Its architecture, traditional shops, restaurants, bars and design and fashion stores give it a unique flair. It is also a popular meeting place for all nightlife lovers. The Bica quarter lies adjacent to the Bairro Alto and Chiado. In addition to its typical streets and houses, it is particularly renowned for its funicular lift, the Ascensor da Bica, built in 1892.

- Chiado

At the end of the 19th century, it became a fashionable meeting place for intellectuals such as Fernando Pessoa, Almada Negreiros and Eça de Queiroz. Their most famous haunt was the café "A Brasileira", which is still today favoured by the city's art students.

- Baixa (Downtown)

One of Lisboa's busiest quarters and also one of the biggest traditional shopping districts.

Almost completely destroyed by the earthquake of 1755, the quarter was rebuilt by Marquês de Pombal, thus earning the name of "Baixa Pombalina". The original uniform, rectilinear architecture is still evident today. The names of the streets parallel to Rua Augusta still allude to the traders and craftsmen based in the area since the Age of the Discoveries.

- Belém

Belém, a quarter standing beside the river, is linked to Portugal's Golden Age of Discoveries as the site where the famous navigators set sail to discover the world. Today it is a spacious green suburb with many gardens, parks and monuments that are well worth a visit. Amongst Belém's attractions are the Jerónimos Monastery, the Monument to the Discoveries, the Torre de Belém, the Belém Cultural Centre and Rua Vieira Portuense.
